The MSHI program is in Candidacy Status, pending accreditation review by the Commission on Accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management Education (CAHIIM).

## Career Outlook

Health informatics is an in-demand industry. The number of medical and health services manager jobs is expected to grow 28 percent by 2031, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (2021). ## Admission Requirements

Qualified applicants for the online Master of Science in Health Informatics program and certificates must hold a bachelor's degree, which can be in any field, and have a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA (on a 4.00 scale). The bachelor's degree or diploma for applicants educated internationally must be from a school or university that grants degrees equivalent to the U.S. bachelor's degree. The University of Pittsburgh will determine whether or not the applicant's international equivalent of a bachelor's degree is acceptable.

We welcome students of all educational and professional backgrounds, but MSHI students typically have experience in health and rehabilitation sciences, health information management, information science, computer science, biology, management, nursing, or other clinical fields.
